The Thesis Statement

An **argumentative paper** makes a **claim** about a **topic** and justifies this claim with specific evidence.

The claim could be an opinion, a policy proposal, an evaluation, a cause-and-effect statement, or an interpretation. The goal of the argumentative paper is to **convince** the audience that the claim is **true** based on the **evidence provided**.

The Thesis Statement should be **specific:**

it should cover only what you will discuss in your paper and should be supported with specific **evidence**.

The thesis statement appears **at the end of the first paragraph** of a paper.

The Thesis Statement should **state your claim** and give **three arguable reasons** for that statement:

The thing is like this because of first reason, second reason, and third reason.

Example of an **argumentative thesis statement**:

Now the essay starts writing itself:

The reasons given in the Thesis Statement can now be used to write the topic sentences for the three paragraphs in the body of the essay.
